THE J. HOWARD REBER MEMORIAL AWARD

The Pennsylvania Players inaugurated their Annual Original One-Act Play Competition in 1937. In 1940, Mr. J. Howard Reber, a prominent attorney and patron of the arts, donated a plaque and instituted an award for this contest.

After the death of Mr. Reber in 1949 Dr. Edgar L. Potts of the English Department asked to continue the award in Mr. Reber's name and doubled the amount of the award.

Since Mr. Potts' retirement in 1964 Dr. Robert E. Jones, a former winner of the award, has continued the prize.

All scripts submitted are read and rated by a Board of Judges. Those plays considered most worthy are given production by the Players. The winning playwright is determined by the judges following the last performance of the plays.
